Independence Square
1859 Jail, Marshal's Home and Museum
217 N. Main (816) 461-1897
 This 1859 Jackson County Jail, with its barred windows, double iron doors and leg chains, once housed Frank James, Jesse James' notorious brother. Special exhibits include a collection of confiscated handmade weapons. Also, learn about Independence's rich Civil War heritage.

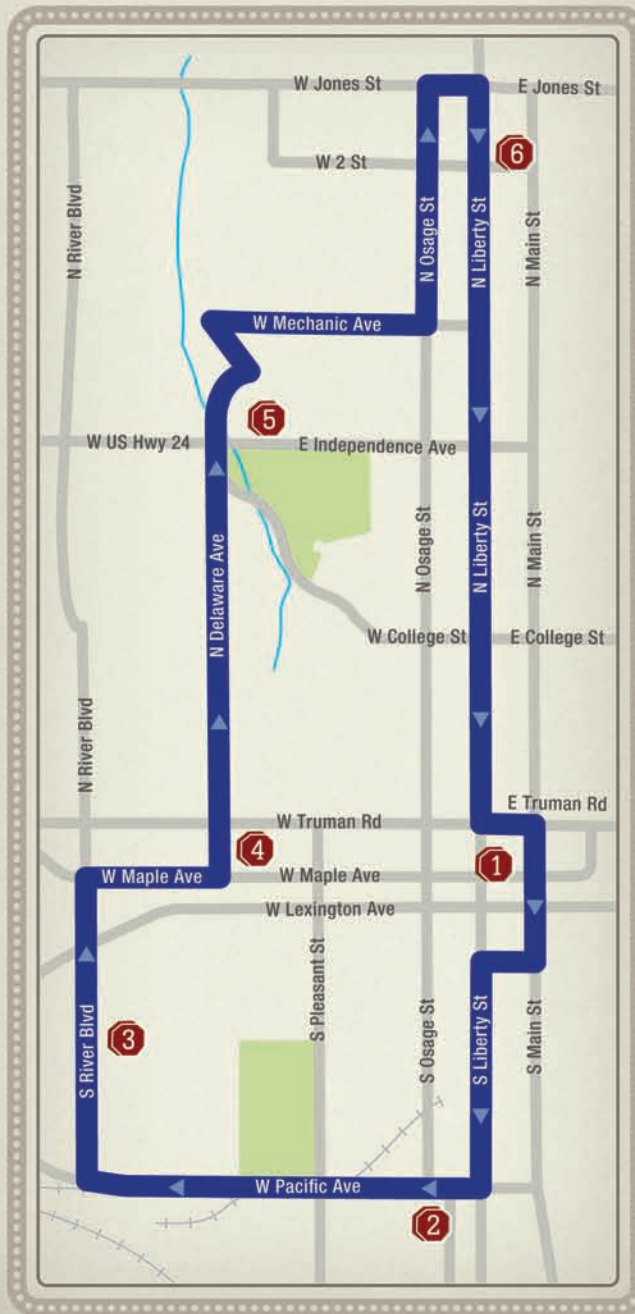
Stop 2
National Frontier Trails Museum
318 W. Pacific (816) 325-7575
 Learn the history of the Santa Fe, California and Oregon Trails and the personal trials and adventures of the pioneers who opened the West. Explore interpretive exhibits and artifacts and the largest collection of books, documents and manuscripts on the Westward Expansion.

Chicago-Alton Railroad Museum
318 W Pacific (816) 325-7955
 Built in 1879, the depot is believed to be the oldest two-story frame depot remaining in Missouri. It was moved to the National Frontier Trails Museum Campus in 1996.

Bingham-Waggoner Estate
313 W. Pacific (816) 461-3491
 Once owned by George C. Bingham, famed Civil War artist. It was also home from 1879-1978 to the Waggoner family, founders of Waggoner Gates Mill. Wagon ruts or swales dating back to the 1830s or '40s can be viewed on the grounds.

Stop 3
Community of Christ Auditorium
1001 W. Walnut (816) 833-1000
 Independence is the international headquarters for the Community of Christ. Highlighting the Temple are a 1,600 seat sanctuary, a 102-rank, 5,700-pipe organ built by Casavant Freres Limitee and a 114-rank Aeolian Skinner organ, one of the largest in the U.S. Children are captivated by the Children's Peace Pavilion, a "hands-on" museum focusing on world peace.



Mormon Visitors Center
937 W. Walnut, (816) 836-3466
 Learn about the key role the Mormons played in the early and tempestuous history of Independence beginning in 1831. The totally remodeled visitors' center features flat screen religious and historical presentations.



Stop 4
Truman Home*
219 N Delaware (816) 254-9929
 The Truman Home offers a glimpse at the personal life of the 33rd President of the U.S. Beautiful in its uncluttered

commonness, the Truman Home showcases the simple life Truman and his beloved Bess enjoyed before and after his presidency. Tours run every 15 minutes from 9am to 5pm. No advance reservations. Groups are limited to 8 people. Visitors also enjoy a visit to the Truman Home Ticket Center with free audio visual show depicting the President's life and the interior of his stately home.

Stop 5
Truman Library and Museum
500 W. 24 Hwy (816) 268-8200
 Experience the eventful and triumphant life of America's 33rd President. Permanent museum attractions include Harry S. Truman: The Presidential Years, an exhibit featuring two decision theaters, audio and video programs and artifacts to engage visitors in the issues and events surrounding the Truman Presidency. Harry S. Truman: His Life and Times, focuses on his life pre- and post-presidency and includes a children's area. The museum also offers a replica of the Oval Office.

Stop 6
Vaile Mansion
1500 N Liberty (816) 325-7430
 Built in 1881 by local entrepreneur and U.S. mail contractor, Harvey Merrick Vaile, according to *Architect* magazine, this ornate 30-room mansion is one of the finest examples of Second-Empire Victorian architecture in the country.
